## STOP THE MONSTER MAST

## Residents twice said 'No' to local masts – this must be respected!



Despite heavy rejection of two unwanted mast proposals, a developer wants to put an intrusive mast on **Fulham Palace Rd**, by the bus shelter near Harbord St, the United Reformed Church and Fulham Cross Academy. If approved, it will be a massive **20 metres / 66 feet** high, well above the height of existing buildings and trees.

It will be totally unsuitable for the character of our locality including two Conservation Areas. Several homes and schools will be within range, and there has not been proper consultation.

Levels of **mast radiation** elsewhere in the borough **already** peak at well above scientists' recommended limit for prolonged exposure. Residents have reported (for instance) sleep difficulties, headaches and palpitations.

This will not be good for our **health**, and especially **children**, whose bodies are not fullyformed. It will also affect our local trees and foliage, and pollinators such as bees.
